

Native American Peace Ambassador dedicates Australian tour to Gold Coast Children's Charity



Friend of the Dalai Lama, former US President Bill Clinton and former President Yasser Arafat, J. Reuben Silverbird, of the Universal Peace Federation is coming to South East Queensland on November 5 and 6.

Son of a Nedhni Apache Wise Man and a Cherokee Medicine Woman, Silverbird is also attached to the United Nations and holds lectures, concerts and retreats around the world.

All profits from his tour will go to support the charity "Paradise Kids" founded on the Gold Coast in 1996 to help children deal with abuse and grief through death, loss or illness. To date the charity has helped more than 11,000 children and their families deal with traumatic situations.

The woman behind the move to bring Silverbird to Australia, Jutta Swan, said: "Silverbird is regularly invited to perform ceremonial blessings at the Nobel Prize

Institute in Oslo, Norway, is an accomplished musician, singer, performer and orator, and has spoken at universities in the United States, Austria and Switzerland".

"His tour is called Sowing the Seeds of Love, which in these times of global and political unrest is a message that is more relevant and meaningful than ever."

Silverbird will appear at the A B Paterson College Auditorium, 10 A B Paterson Drive, Arundel, on November 5, and at the Coolum Civic Centre, Jack Morgan Park, Park Street, Coolum Beach, November 6.
